Lobby Meeting with Alexa Brenner, Representative Emily Randall's Pierce Co. Field Representative April 1, 2025 Notes by Elly Claus-McGahan

What we learned:

- Rep. Randall is on the Natural Resources Committee and subcommittees: Indian and Insular Affairs, Federal Lands
 - We can contact Alexa to invite Rep Randall and Alexa to public events we are hosting
- Rep Randall wants to hear from us on legislative issues and asks. We can share those with Alexa or phone or email. She wants to know what her constituents are thinking.

What we shared:

- What our chapters do: tabling, No on I- 2117 postcard writing, presentations, lobbying
- Statistics about CCL National, CCL Tacoma and CCL Bainbridge.
- 2 national Lobbying events each year, this year July 19-22 in DC and in November Virtual.
- PC Climate Conversation and what it does connection to County Executive Ryan Mello.
- Clean Energy Credits and IRA impacts several handouts and NYT article
- Yale Climate Communications' Six Americas how public opinion has shifted on climate concern
- House of Rep. Climate Solutions Caucus 2024 as possible source of climate allies

Our ask on Permitting Reform:

- CCL seeks bills that garner bipartisan support for durability
- Main lobbying goals for Spring 2025:
 - Protect clean energy tax credits from the Inflation Reduction Act
 - They account for 45% of the projected GHG reductions
 - Pass new Permitting Reform legislation
 - Without, 80% fewer GHG reductions would be realized due to clean energy project not getting built
 - Transmission lines have been expanding 1% per year, but to meet our clean energy goals, needs to triple by 2050
 - Currently <u>Environmental Impact Statements</u> take 4.5 years to complete and a new transmission line can take a <u>decade</u> to build
 - 95% of new energy projects currently awaiting permits are for solar, wind or battery storage, less than 5% are natural gas projects
- What CCL would like to see in new legislation?
 - Speed up the pace of new clean energy projects
 - Triple our clean electricity transmission by 2050
 - Allow local communities to give input early in the process

Progress of the Environmental Coalition's Legislative Priorities

Let's keep up the support and help get these bills over the finish line! You can keep tabs on bills at the **WCA's <u>Environmental bill tracker</u>** or type in the bill number on the <u>state legislature website.</u>

Strengthen the Clean Fuels law (HB1409) Passed the House, now in Senate for second reading.

Sewage Release Notification (HB 1670, SB 5450) Passed the House now in Senate Committee.

<u>Recycling Reform Act</u> (HB 1150, SB 5284) Passed the Senate now in House committee, second reading.

CURB Pollution Act (SB 5380 HB1303) Did not make it to the floor for a full House vote.

<u>Right to repair digital electronics</u> (HB 1483, SB 5423) Passed the House (with a 94-1 vote!) and Senate (48-1!)

Initiative 1-2066 Struck Down March 23, 2025 (from an email from WAConservationAction)

"King County Superior Court Judge Sandra Widlan struck down Initiative 2066, ruling that the initiative was unconstitutional on three separate grounds.

As you know, **WCA** worked against this initiative from the moment it was filed in spring 2024. We recognized from the start that I-2066 was overly broad and misleading and would set back efforts to decarbonize our state's buildings, a major source of greenhouse gas emissions. I-2066 backers said the initiative would protect natural gas, but in reality, state law already does just that. Instead, I-2066 sought to weaken our state **Clean Air Act**, attack energy efficiency in our building codes, and prevent utilities from helping customers afford higher-efficiency electric appliances. All to ensure that wealthy developers and the fossil fuel industry could maintain their profits and business as usual. **WCA** led efforts to fight **I-2066**. We built a coalition to oppose it, organized voter education against it, and mobilized members like you to get involved. We rallied our coalition to keep up the fight even when the odds and short notice to Election Day worked against us. After the election, we filed our legal challenge with a broad coalition of local governments, businesses, and organizations to stop this unconstitutional initiative from taking us backward."
