Tabling, Linda Cohan and Barbara Menne—August 24-Hilltop Street Fair. We had a good crew and passed out a lot of information about NO on I-2117 using the informative little businesssized cards and other handouts. A perfect lead-in was telling people about the Tacoma Public Utilities \$200 credit from a grant program funded by the Climate Commitment Act! It has been announced on recent **TPU** energy bills. People appreciated learning that they could apply for it and the fact that **I- 2117** would take away benefits like this by repealing the CCA. There was also some opportunity to talk about electrification in that day's tabling.

<u>NO on I-2117</u> Campaign, Chuck and Barbara—They participated last weekend in putting informative leaflets on people's doorsteps, and the focus next weekend will be canvasing door to door for persuasive conversations with residents. On Saturday 9/28 there will be phone-banking—ask about the training webinar on Zoom for that. Linda Cohan and Elly Claus-McGahan are helping at the No on I-2117 booth at the State Fair this week. NO on I-2066 Campaign, Peggy LovellFord and Barbara-- I-2066 undermines the Clean Air Act and is trying to undo HB-1589, which is a planning bill that promotes energy efficiency in *NEW* construction by discouraging the use of natural gas. I-2066 has a lot of deliberately confusing and alarming language claiming that "they are trying to take away your natural gas." HB-1589 will not take away anyone's gas appliances, but any building in WA from January on will not have natural gas piped into it, plus the rebates for natural gas appliances will cease. In the long run, however, I-2066 would raise costs. Puget Sound Energy is actually against the initiative; they do not want to invest in outdated technology in new buildings.

## **CCL** National clip

First, Flannery Winchester celebrated over 4000 conversations about electrification by CCL members, well over the 3000 goal set for Electrification Month in August! The other topic was permitting reform (needed to speed up clean energy transmission) and CCL's endorsement of the Energy Permitting Reform Act of 2024 as an important piece of the climate puzzle: "Since it was introduced in the Senate in late July, we've been eagerly awaiting analysis of its expected climate impacts. The most respected voices in climate and energy modeling have been hard at work figuring out those impacts: Resources for the Future, Rocky Mountain Institute, Jesse Jenkins from Princeton University's Zero Lab, and Third Way. Last week, this expert team released their findings. In every scenario they modeled, these groups found that the Energy Permitting Reform Act of 2024 will reduce climate pollution!" It could deliver a 10-25% reduction, a clear overall win for climate. We at CCL Tacoma can feel comfortable endorsing and promoting this bipartisan bill even though it does have some fossil fuel components. Here's a link to email your members of Congress.

### Local Candidate Interviews, partnering with League of Women Voters:

**LWV Tacoma/Pierce County** hosts an extensive online candidate forum during September and October each year. **Chuck** is on their board and says they are very open to accepting climate-related questions (climate is not usually addressed in their own questions). They are also

nonpartisan, in fact if either of the two candidates doesn't show up, they cancel that particular forum. The exact dates are being set now; **Chuck** will keep us informed. So far we have: **9/25** 6:30 pm: **Pierce County Council District #2** candidates **Paul Herrera** and **Davida Haygood 10/3** 6:30 pm: **Pierce County Council District #4** candidates **Rosie Ayala** and **Rodney Robinson** Go to League of Women Voters to get Zoom links.

We had a discussion about the best climate questions to submit and how to phrase them. We wanted to cover I-2117, county climate hazards, and county planning policies, questions geared especially for **County Council candidates.** We would like to either fold in something about **environmental justice** in questions 1-3 or create a 4<sup>th</sup> question for that issue. (The following are rough drafts only, they will be finalized by **Barbara** and **Elly**)

- 1) "Can you speak on the implementation of the Climate Commitment Act in Pierce County, and where do you stand on I-2117?"
- 2) "What are you thinking Pierce County needs to do to keep all its residents safer from heat, smoke and wildfire and flooding events?"
- 3) "What actions do you plan to take in support of the Comprehensive Plan and Sustainability Plan, particularly for the goal of becoming carbon neutral by 2050?"
